

# **Copyright for Teaching**

This guide aims to help you determine what material you can copy, any copying limits that may apply and the best way to share certain information with students.

Collective works (short stories, plays)	Hard copy original	Bookmark & submit a digitisation request. You may request up 15 pages.	Yes

NZ Standards	Hard copy	Bookmark & submit a digitisation request. Copying limits apply, check with Library.	No
	Digital copy	Bookmark in Course Resources or share a link on Blackboard.	Yes
TV & Radio Broadcast sound recordings	Online	Play in the classroom or share a link on Blackboard or Course Resources.	Yes
Youtube videos	Online	Play in the classroom or share a link on Blackboard or Course Resources.	Yes
Kanopy films	Online	Play in the classroom or share a link on Blackboard or Course Resources.	No
Lightbox or Netflix	Online	You <b>cannot</b> share Netflix or Lightbox material in the classroom. Consider asking students to purchase a subscription.	No

## **Permitted Educational Uses**

The Copyright Act 1994 (section 44-49) allows the following use of material, with attribution.

You may:

- copy any material for the purposes of examination.
- make one single copy of a literary, dramatic, musical or artistic work for use in the classroom.
- copy up to 3% or 3 pages to distribute to students of a literary, dramatic or musical work. You must wait 14 days to copy another 3% or 3 pages of the same work.

**E.g.** you may share an image, table or diagram from the internet in a lecture presentation, as long as you provide attribution through a reference or an attribution slide.

### Legally sharing works from online sources

If you want to share a PDF or a file online with students on Blackboard legally then you need to check the associated copyright information. Most websites will have either a "Copyright" or "Terms & Conditions" page, usually found at the very bottom of a home page. This is where you'll find further copyright information.

Look for statements such as "use of content on this site is permitted for educational use only." If it says "All Rights Reserved" you will have to ask permission. Check for the webmaster's contact information and email them.

### Finding openly licensed material

To use material without worrying about copyright then search for copyright free or openly licensed material. This is material that either has a Creative Commons licence or where copyright has expired and it is in the public domain.

Creative Commons licences are made up of six licences that give users permission in advance to use works for permitted uses. Each licence has a different level of permission, and most licences ask that you attribute the creator.
